
The Comet C/2023 A3 Tsuchinshan Atlas has survived the trip around the Sun and is now visible after sunset in the west! Each night it will be higher in the sky as it travels out of our solar system. This comet is bright and has an enormous tail!


PlanIt! Pro users, just in time for the increasing solar activity, there is a new feature for planning for aurora. You can access it via the ephemeris features. Below is a screenshot of the plan from Thursday night's aurora.

So far, 2024 has been full of amazing celestial events. Although Milky Way season is just about done, it doesn't mean the night skies don't have anything of interest to photograph. The winter constellations and deep space objects are starting to become visible. In the aurora time-lapse, you can see the Pleiades over the bridge on the left side of the frame. The Pleiades, also known as the Seven Sisters is beautiful to look at and also photograph.


